Governor Steve Breshear Signs Pension Reform Into Law

On June 27, 2008 Governor Steve Breshear signed pension reform legislation that will hopefully secure the future of all state, city, and county workers retirement system. While not everyone is in support of this particular piece of legislation everyone is in agreement that something must be done and done now. The issue was really very simple. At the current rate of retirees and the skyrocketing cost of healthcare the fund would be bankrupt in the not too distant future. The highlights of the bill include:

- Requires workers hired after Sept. 1 to contribute another 1 % of their pay toward their health care.
- Requires future workers in nonhazardous jobs to have a combined age and years of service of 87, with a minimum age of 57, to retire. Workers can now retire at any age with 27 years of service.
- Reduces the annual cost-of-living adjustment to 1.5 percent for current and future retirees upon retirement. The adjustment is now based on inflation.
- Closes loopholes that boost benefit packages, such as limiting to 12 months the amount of unused sick time that can be counted in calculating benefits. Currently there is no limit.
- Prohibits retirees who return to state government jobs from getting second pensions — a practice known as double-dipping.
- Sets a timeline to bring the retirement systems back to full funding by 2025.
- Reduces for one year the amount of money counties and cities must contribute to the County Employee Retirement System.

This may not be the best possible plan but it is a start that most retirement groups have bought into and for good reason. A bankrupt retirement system is totally unacceptable! For more information go to www.kyret.com.

Changes to IFSAC Testing Methods

IFSAC requires that its accredited entities certify to the current NFPA Standard. This year we must undergo a reaccreditation visit. That means we will be required to bring our testing methods up to current NFPA standards. Therefore, Kentucky will continue to test firefighters to the current accredited standards until September 1st, 2008. September 1st will be the transition date, and we will begin to test firefighters to the new standard in effect at that time. What this means is all written and skills testing will utilize updated skill sheets and test banks after September 1st, 2008. These updated skill sheets will not be available for publishing until after July 1st, 2008. They will be published on the Area 9 and KFA websites as soon as they are available. RESOURCE TYPING AND CREDENTIALING

Department of Homeland Security continues to work toward a nationally recognized resource typing and responder credentialing system. Nine new workgroups have been formed to attempt to bring closure on this initiative. One of the workgroups is Fire / Hazardous Materials. Bryant Stiles is representing the National Volunteer Fire Council on this group. Also on this workgroup is Tom Arnold from the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security. The most recent meeting of this group was held on June 23-25 and a draft document was finalized which will be shared with stakeholders not involved in the workgroup for their comment. An ambitious goal of end of summer of 2008 for completion of the project has been set.

ASSISTANCE TO FIREFIGHTERS GRANT PROGRAM Each year nine organizations are invited to the National Fire Academy to meet with USFA / FEMA Grant personnel to review and make

recommendations for the criteria for grants for the next year. The nine organizations are the organizations which successfully developed and lobbied for the passage of the original grant program. One of the nine organizations is the National Volunteer Fire Council (NVFC). Each organization provides three representatives for this meeting. Bryant Stiles was one of the three National Volunteer Fire Council representatives to the criteria development meeting for the second year. The meeting was held at the National Fire Academy on July 9th and 10th.

One of the major issues for the program is the number of departments which have never received a grant. This issue is critical to Kentucky, as we have many departments which have yet to receive a grant. A second issue is the question on the application about the level of training of the applicant department's firefighters.

An issue for us in Kentucky is the number of departments which do not submit an application. Some believe departments not submitting applications choose not to submit due to having all the equipment needed. I believe there must be other reasons.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP? If your department has submitted applications but has not been approved for a grant, please send me notes on what you applied for, the amount applied for and the year(s) you have applied. If your department has chosen not to apply, please send me notes on why you did not apply. These notes may be sent to my email address, bryant.stiles@kctcs.edu.

We will not be able to automatically solve your problem, but if we can find some problems which are common among a large number of departments, we may be able to address those.

Please remember, you cannot receive a grant unless you applied. The odds are not bad. One in four applications are funded.

As always, I appreciate the President and Board of the Kentucky Firefighters Association to allow me to be one of your two representatives to the National Volunteer Fire Council.

Richard was named Person of the Year by the Automatic Fire Alarm Association (AFAA). The award was presented recently at the AFAA's national conference.

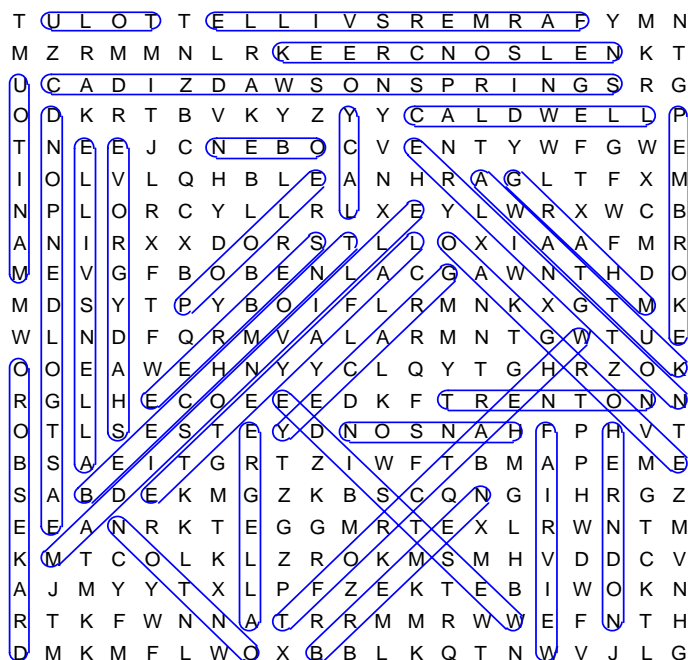

Honda lawn mowers recalled



The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission on July 9, 2008, announced the recall of about 20,500 Honda lawn mowers due to a laceration hazard.

The rear shield on the affected mowers can break off, possibly allowing debris to be thrown toward the person mowing.
